

## Our new location Dock 2

An Agreement has been signed with Government for a long term lease of Dock 2. This will enable us to house the *City of Adelaide* on land, and to develop a Seaport Village on the Dock. Once on land external work can start on the ship.

Important within the Agreement are provisions for:

- A very large area for a Seaport Village, providing for hours of activity for visitors.
- Access from the end of Dock 1, as well as the existing roads via Ocean Steamers Rd.
- Asbestos removal from Sheds 13 & 14. Shed 13 will be used by ourselves and to display the *Annie* Watt. Shed 14 will be used by the Maritime Museum, *Falie and One & All*.

The site is being developed by our volunteer, not for profit, clipper ship organisation, not Government.

The barge will be moved to Dock 2 by end of the year, and work started to prepare the site to move the ship from the barge onto land in 2021.

Tours and events will continue throughout this period, except for a short time around the actual move.





## What is a Seaport Village?

It is an experience based, hands on, education and tourist destination where a colonial seaport is recreated so that the visitor can step back in time.

The Village is the maritime equivalent of the popular and successful Sovereign Hill in Ballarat, Victoria.

It provides visitors with an unforgettable glimpse into a past where they can climb aboard historic tall ships and imagine the hardships and adventures of life at sea, and enjoy their heritage charm.

Offers a tremendous opportunity for telling the State's story. It will identify that Port Adelaide represents the whole foundation era of South Australia's social and economic history.
